QUICK GUIDE TO MEDI-CAL COVERAGE OF DOULA SERVICES

DHCS PROVIDER MANUAL - ESSENTIALS & TIPS

Starting on 1/1/2023, Medi-Cal covers full spectrum doula care, as preventive services.

Doula services are aimed at preventing perinatal complications and improving health outcomes for birthing parents and infants. Doulas serving Medi-Cal beneficiaries provide person-centered, culturally competent care that supports the racial, ethnic, linguistic, and cultural diversity of beneficiaries while adhering to evidence-based best practices.

Recommendation for Doula Services:

Medi-Cal beneficiary can receive a written recommendation to authorize the benefit from a physician or other licensed practitioner of the healing arts acting within their scope of practice under state law. The doula should keep a copy of this in their records.



- Complete a **minimum of 16 hours (total) of training** in the following areas:
 - Lactation support
 - Childbirth education
 - Foundations on anatomy of pregnancy and childbirth
 - Nonmedical comfort measures, prenatal support, and labor support techniques
 - Developing a community resource list
- Provide support at a minimum of three births.

OPTION 2: EXPERIENCE PATHWAY

- At least 5 years of active doula experience in either a paid or volunteer capacity within the previous seven years.
- Attestation to skills in prenatal, labor, and postpartum care as demonstrated by **3 letters of recommendation**.
 - **One letter must be** from a licensed provider, a community-based organization, or an enrolled doula.
 - The last two letters can be written client testimonial letters and/or professional letters of recommendation from a physician, licensed behavioral health provider, nurse practitioner, nurse midwife, licensed midwife, enrolled doula, or community-based organization. All letters must be written within the last seven years.





Doula minimum qualifications:

- Must be at least 18 years old
- Possess an adult and infant CPR certification
- Have completed basic HIPAA training
- Meet one of the below qualification pathways
- Have a <u>National Provider Identifier (NPI)</u>

BLACK Doula Consortium Tips:

Certificate of completion for Adult CPR and Infant CPR can come from either the **American Red Cross** or **American Heart Association**.

BLACK DOULA CONSORTIUM TIP:

If you will be using the **Experience Pathway** to enroll as a Medi-Cal doula, now is the time to **identify 3 individuals - a client, a licensed provider or a community-based organization,** who can provide you a letter of recommendation.

EXAMPLES OF RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

ACCEPTABLE

- 1. Letter from a licensed provider, CBO, or enrolled doula
- 2. Written client testimony
- 3. Written client testimony

ACCEPTABLE

NOT ACCEPTABLE

- 1. Written client testimony

RECOMMENDED TRAININGS TO SERVE TO UNIQUE NEEDS OF MEDICAL-BENEFICIARIES:

- Perinatal support
- Hands-on support with clients
- Trauma-informed care
- Cultural sensitivity or competency
- Implicit bias or anti-racism
- Social determinants of health for birthing populations
- Perinatal mood and anxiety disorders
- Intimate partner violence
- Postpartum care/support
- Infant and newborn care
- Perinatal loss and bereavement support

CONTINUING EDUCATION

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doulas must **complete three hours of continuing education** in maternal, perinatal, and/or infant care every three years.
- Maintain evidence of completed training to be made available to DHCS upon request. Doulas do not need to attain CEUs, just proof of training.

FINAL TIPS:

- In order to be approved for reimbursement for any family with Medi-Cal, you will need to apply through both the PAVE Medi-Cal provider portal and contract with your local Managed Care Plan(s).
- Review PAVE carefully for additional requirements
- Most Medi-Cal managed care plans will require doulas and/or doula groups to **have liability insurance**.
